4 Activities of the organization in the field of Social Development:

4.1 Prarabdh Project, Gangagarh Village, Bulandshahr District

The Prarabdh project in collaboration with the Alok Charitable Trust is being implemented at the SRB Alok School in the village of Gangagarh in Bullandshehr District of Uttar Pradesh.

The program is designed to facilitate the learning journeys of the 780 students of the school. As part of the program a computer lab and library have been established in the school. These facilities are usually unavailable in rural schools in India.

The Diksha Foundation and The Alok Charitable Trust have endeavoured to bring these facilities to the students in the district of Bullandshehr. The School has acquired government recognition up to high school level and will soon be raised to intermediate level. The school currently has 780 students and this number will go up in the coming years. The school has 27 staff members.

The changing paradigms in education have been included in the curriculum of the schools and learning centres. We are equipping the students to become holistic learners by inculcating early reading habits. The School library has pictorial books, short stories, Panchtantra books, science books etc. A library period has been added in the timetable to stress the importance of reading to all the students. The school runs remedial and extra classes after school hours to give extra attention to the students. Early orientation classes in computers have also been initiated so that the students can be introduced to technological tools of learning. The Computer Lab has 12 computers with power backup facility. The lab is utilized after school hours to offer computer training to the youth of the area.



4.2 Neeraj Kumar Memorial Learning Centre (KHEL Project), Hilsa, Nalanda

The Niraj Kumar Memorial Learning Centre is located in Hilsa a sub-division of Nalanda district in Bihar; the centre has been operational since April, 2011. Based on the KHEL (Knowledge Hubs for Education and Learning) model, the centre offers supplementary education to children studying in government schools and remedial education to school drop-outs. The project is a joint initiative of Alok Charitable Trust and Diksha Foundation; it is supported by the CSR department of Mediaguru.

As the name KHEL suggests we have incorporated studying and playing together. We try to take examples from day to day life and make the children a part of the learning process through activities and games. This makes the class very interesting and keeps the children involved in almost all the activities. It takes more time but is very effective. We want to teach them pictorially which is more effective for learning. We use "learn while you play" method for teaching. They all sit together in groups of 4 to 6 students which make learning interesting. Currently, we are catering to 40 students. In the next quarter, we are planning to expand our outreach up to 60 students. We are also starting vocational training in computers. We are using Microsoft's Unlimited Potential Program curriculum.



4.3 Knowledge Hub for Education and Learning, Patna

KHEL (Knowledge Hubs for Education and Learning) Patna came into operation on December 2010. The project is funded by individual donors, philanthropists, family and friends. The beneficiaries of this project are either school drop-outs or children who have never been to school. The project mainly caters to children between 6 to 14 years of age who belong to underprivileged communities. Activities within KHEL involve basic literacy and numeric classes, cultural activities such as music, dance and drama, sports practices and teams, education regarding child rights with more subject specific learning. In order to mainstream these children the project has been striving with its designed set of programs.

Activities within KHEL involve basic literacy and numeric classes, cultural activities such as music, dance or drama, sports practices and teams, education regarding child rights with more subject-specific learning. The use of mass media such as radio and television, written materials like news sheets and comics, may act as the key instrument in teaching-learning process. Non-Formal education Under KHEL shall lead to either mainstreaming of school drop-outs into the formal education system and/or enrolment into skill enhancement programme for industry placements/trainings depending on the need and orientation of the student.



5 Direct Beneficiaries:

Diksha Foundation through the projects that it implements has directly reached out to a very wide target audience. The direct beneficiaries from our programme include 1000 children and 100 youth — who are served on a daily basis. Building leadership at every level the Foundation has assisted teachers, students and youth volunteers to take on and lead social campaigns.
